All delivered OSB prices in this section are derived from weekly market price assessments. The Spruce and Douglas Fir plywood prices are all derived from the Toronto 3/8-inch price. The 3/8-inch prices for other destinations are based on freight adders or deducts using Toronto as the base. In each destination column, the price for each thickness below the 3/8-inch price is derived from formulas using 3/8-inch as the basis. The 1-inch panel prices reflect additional costs at the manufacturing level.

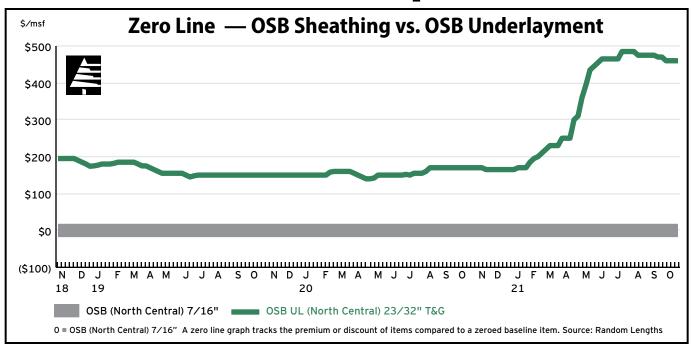

### **Oriented Strand Board**

Sales trends were mixed across North America, but sheathing prices continued to post modest increases as demand outstripped supplies by a thin margin. Buyers avoided taking heavy positions, maintaining a cautious approach to the fourth quarter.

In northern markets, inquiries were strongest in the West. Reported prices of sheathing in Western Canada finished the week \$15 higher, and some sales were reported \$20-25 over last week's levels. Some buyers in the West looked to cover their needs from mills in Eastern Canada due to lower prices and quicker shipping times. Sales within Eastern Canada were modest.

In the South, trading eased compared to recent weeks as buyer urgency faded. Distributors

and dealers limited new purchases primarily to immediate needs. Moderate volumes of 7/16-inch sheathing sold at \$515 in the Southwest in late trading. Some buyers, however, paid \$460-465 to Southeast mills and shipped those loads to westside markets.

Mill order files ranged from late October to mid-November. Sparse sales and lackluster demand left prices flat in Los Angeles and Phoenix. Trading was slightly more active in Sacramento. Sales into the Mountain States were quiet.

## Southern Plywood

Reported prices were firm to slightly higher, but mills with extended order files noted subdued demand. Many buyers held back, digesting inventories before seeking any replenishment.



Upward price momentum in rated sheathing faded in late trading.

Mill quotes extending into early November limited follow-through from the prior week's action. Rated sheathing prices were flat to up \$5-15. 23/32-inch was the strongest seller and difficult to source. Prices of sanded AC/BC posted double-digit gains amid scant supplies of imported panels.

Wholesalers closely aligned quotes with mill replacement levels in response to dwindling sales. Distributors remained steady supplying buyers with fill-in volumes. Truck shortages and understaffing on the railroads pushed lead times further out in some regions.

## **Western Plywoood**

Western sheathing prices grinded higher in modest increments. Mills quoting at the higher end of the price ranges experienced fewer sales. Prices for sanded and siding panels were stagnant. Spotty discounts in underlayment surfaced amid reports of limited demand, but prices held.

Mill order files ranged from the latter half of October into the early weeks of November. Buyers, with a hint of caution, purchased conservative volumes to fill in inventories. Wholesalers reported limited interest from their customers.

Thick sheathing panels drew buyers' attention, while 1/2-inch 4-ply remained fluid. Lightly produced 1/2-inch 3-ply led price gains. Producers kept their mill grade output cleaned up.

## **Canadian Plywood**

Canadian plywood prices remained static amid a dearth of market direction. Buyers considered the

time of year and the previous volatile price cycle, prompting them to limit purchases to less-than-truckload volumes. Demand from the residential construction sector far outpaced other segments.

Additional intermodal costs for shipments moving east severely limited those transactions. Instead, producers tried to sell open-market volumes into the West, where sales were often described as solid. Eastern buyers turned more toward box car loadings. Demand for D-grade remained fluid, and spreads with on-grade panels remained narrow.

#### Veneer

Demand for Douglas Fir 54s from the LVL and hardwood plywood sectors was steady. Some green ends reported more inquiries from both sectors, leading to a sense of firming veneer prices.

Softwood plywood producers reported discounted levels on both 54s and 27s as plywood sales remained modest in the U.S. and quiet in Canada. Buyers' interest in fishtails was limited.

### **Non-Structural Panels**

Unrelenting demand kept non-structural panel buyers seeking coverage. An announced resin price hike, effective this month, motivated producers to pass the higher costs along. Most particleboard producers, however, sold at their recently established prices this week. Many focused on shipping to core customers as promptly as possible.

Some MDF buyers sought coverage as far out as January. Tight supplies supported firm prices. Box store demand for underlayment eased from the scorching pace evident earlier in the year toward more traditional demand levels. Modest volumes of 3/4-inch melamine captured steep premiums.

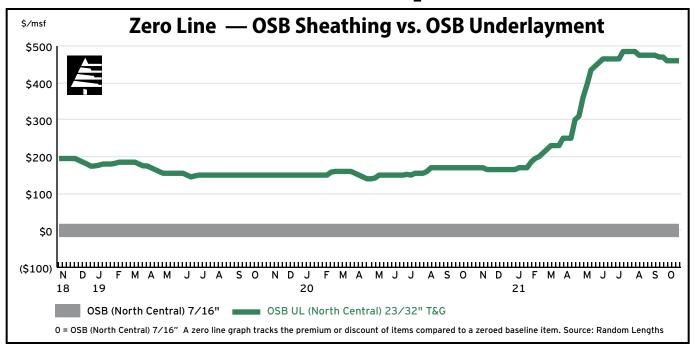
